

HEROD AGRIPPA AD 37-46



Herod Agrippa I (AD 37-44) was the ruler of the Roman province of Judaea. A confederate of the deranged Roman Emperor Caligula—who believed himself to be the Jewish Messiah—Agrippa vigorously persecuted followers of Jesus, imprisoning the Apostle Peter. According to Acts, Agrippa was struck down by God for accepting the praise of sycophants, and his body was eaten by worms.

Bronze Judaea coins of this era were crudely struck, frequently resulting in partial and off-center details.
